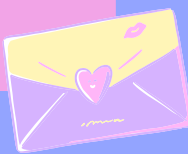


KG2 Learning Center Addition

KG1 Learning Center Animal World

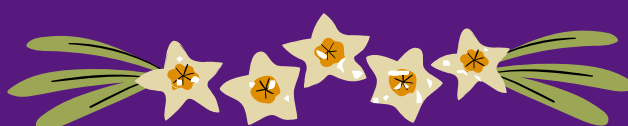
