


#### **ALL DANCE EUROPE 2024**




The Handing Over Ceremony, a momentous occasion marking the transition of responsibilities from Grade 12 leaders to their deputies, was celebrated on the 28th of


# CORNUCOPIA

One day, while playing with Almathea, Zeus accidentally broke off its horn. But Zeus, being the very powerful and magical child that he was, blessed the horn with the virtue of abundance. Many images of Zeus show him holding this horn.

It's a concept that transcends mythology and finds resonance in our daily lives, even in the stories of remarkable individuals like Ratan Tata.


