National Level Brain Bee








BriBooks-NYAF 2024


Anvay Vashney

International Yoga Day











PARENT ORIENTATIONS



















Exploring Trigonometry Like Never Before!

What if trigonometry could be fun, visual, and as thrilling as a Ferris wheel ride? That's exactly what students experienced in a unique four-part workshop designed to bring abstract math to life. It was conducted by Mr. Kiran Ananthpur Bacche, co-founded of Dhimath, an organization focused on making mathematics learning joyful and accessible for all ages, from 11th June to 27th June 2025.


In the first session, sine and cosine functions were introduced through the metaphor of a Ferris wheel — with height and shadow showing students how circular motion becomes mathematical beauty. A custom-designed trigonometry board helped students visualize all six trigonometric functions at once. Next came the Game of Dots and Antidots, where solving identities felt like a strategy game. With characters like Captain America and Thanos making surprise appearances, math became both playful and powerful.

In the third session, students unlocked the secrets of division — from arithmetic to trigonometry — through clear visual patterns, seeing how everything in math connects. The final session turned multiplication into movement! Students saw how shifting dots in different directions represented multiplication by sine, cosine, and more — no rote learning, just deep understanding. By the end, students weren't just solving problems; they were seeing math from a whole new perspective!


The visit left a lasting impact, teaching the students valuable lessons in empathy, service, and the importance of respecting and caring for the elderly.








Because of its attitude.


Attitude is the belief that we can.
