Jain Heritage School, Hebbal, organised a Model United Nations Conference from 2 to 4 July 2026.

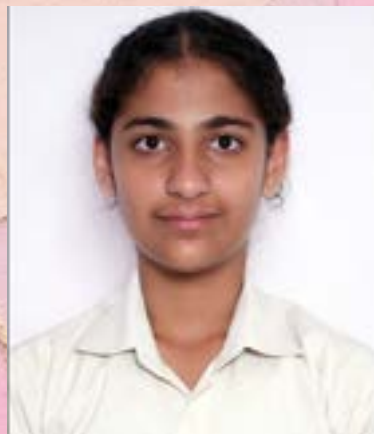
Our students achieved the following honours:

THE RELEVANCE OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE AGE OF AI

On 17th July 2026, Grade 11 and 12 Commerce and Humanities students attended a session on "The Relevance of Higher Education in the Age of AI," conducted by Prof. (Dr.) Nisha Nair, Professor at Jindal Global Law School and Vice Dean, Office of Admissions and Outreach, O.P. Jindal Global University.

The session highlighted the continuing relevance of higher education in an AI-driven world and explored disciplines such as Law, Economics, Liberal Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, and Public Policy. Students gained insights into how these fields foster critical thinking, ethical reasoning and interdisciplinary perspectives that remain invaluable in a rapidly evolving world.

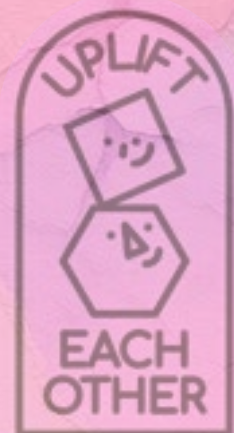


COMMUNITY SERVICE

A detective solves crimes. Who solves the puzzles of the human body? A doctor. But what makes a great doctor? Three qualities: curiosity, compassion, and courage.
